The county championships were also held at Clevedon this year and won by Hannah Woodley, setting a new course record, a great achievement. Congratulations to Hannah and Steve, they will be having a baby next year and probably little time for golf, with priorities at home.

Training on and off the course would be provided at county level with back up from the Regional Course Advisor. Expenses are paid.

2. Minutes of the Annual General Meeting 2021

The minutes of the 2021 AGM approved and signed as a true and correct record. There were no matters arising.

3. Hon. Treasurer's Report and Statement of Accounts

Madam President, Captain, Ladies and Gentlemen.

- 1. This has been my 1st year as your Treasurer. I would like to present the accounts for the year ended 30th September 2022, which have been audited by our auditor Judith Sperring.
- 2. The <u>Balance Sheet</u> shows that we have £22,593 in our Current Account and there is £25,000 in a Bank Deposit Account. In summary, we have plenty of money! We will continue to spend this money to further the interests of ladies and girls golf in Somerset in accordance with our constitution.
- 3. The stocks include £141 of presentation glasses and logoed merchandise, together with £530 of logoed golf balls, which we present as 2s prizes in our competitions and are used by our teams when representing Somerset.
- 4. The prepayment of £700 relates to a deposit for the team accommodation for the 2023 InterCounty Finals, which will be held at Cumberwell Park in Wiltshire.
- 5. The £1,750 creditor was due to England Golf and relates to affiliation fees that we collect from our members on their behalf.
- 6. On the <u>Profit & Loss Account</u>, the majority of our income comes from the Somerset Ladies Affiliation Fees (£13,703) and from the County Card payments (£5,347). In January 2022 we decided to reduce the affiliation fees paid by our junior girls from £10 (including county card) to only £1, which is the same as the Somerset boys. In 2022, we have received affiliation fees from 1578 ladies and 80 junior girls.
- 7. Looking at the income from the various County Competitions:
 - we made a loss of £373 this year on the County Championship. When the Championship green fees were originally negotiated with Clevedon it was for a 3 day competition, so the total costs exceeded the entry fees charged for the 1 day event.
 - Although the Rogers Cup also appears to have run at a loss, this is not the case. The figures include the costs of both the 2021 and 2022 finals because the 2021 finals were played after our financial year end of 30th September. We have actually made a small profit in both years.
 - The Fowler Lock Greensomes weas sadly not played in 2022.
- 8. We received a grant of £2,000 from England Golf for hosting the SouthWest Intercounties at Clevedon. As our expenses only came to £825, we made a net profit of £1,175. (And we won!)
- 9. Overall our team expenses are less than 2021.
 - Intercounty match week costs of £3,097 relate to travel, food and accommodation for the

event at Clevedon, and were about £1,500 less than in 2021.

- the total costs of taking the 1st team to the National Finals at Stoneham golf club near Southampton were about £4,945. We received another grant of £4,000 from England Golf as a contribution towards our costs and £211 of late claims will be included in the 2023 accounts.
- 10. The amount of £600 for Honorariums relates to the grants given to The County Captain, President, Vice-Captain, and Auditor.
- 11. Executive expenses of £1,275 relates mainly to travel, which has increased because we have raised the mileage claim rate to the approved AA rate, and also includes £178 for the purchase of some more SLCGA Executive badges.
- 12. Back in January, we realised that our insurance cover for our beautiful trophies was inadequate. So we had all the trophies for the Somerset Ladies, Juniors, Past Captains and Seniors properly valued and catalogued. We have increased our insurance premiums accordingly. The Seniors and Past Captains have contributed to these costs.
- 13. The SLCGA provide financial support to our Junior girls through a £750 annual contribution for Junior Coaching and the funding of the Junior Spring meeting, County Junior Championship and Southwest Junior Intercounties. The 2022 Junior Intercounties cost £4,105, which is much more than last year when there was a problem with the accommodation. I also oversee the Junior finances and am pleased to report that in 2022 the Junior Committee have started to award Junior Performance and development bursaries. The Junior coaching account balance at 30th September was £11,961. The Junior accounts have been audited this year for the 1st time.

Does anyone have any questions?

Louise Buxton presented the audited accounts for the year ended 30th September 2022, which had been circulated to all executive committee members in advance of the meeting with explanations of certain items:-

The total bank balance was £47,593

The total affiliation fees (including county cards) received from our members amounted to £19,050 The net profit for the year was £2,586

The junior coaching account balance at 30th September was £11,961.

The issue was raised that the combined funds in the SLCGA and junior coaching accounts are too much and how will these funds be used in future. A discussion followed as to possible uses of the excess funds which included junior bursaries and keeping competition entry fees low.

The accounts were adopted by the meeting.

4. Reports

County Captain

Gill Brown

This year's South West Inter Counties was hosted by Somerset at Clevedon Golf Club, the course was in excellent condition, and many positive comments received from the other counties. The event ran smoothly with the help from Reece Miller and his team at Clevedon. Sandra, Jackie and Angie excellently ran the Tournament Office throughout the event.

Somerset never make things easy, entering the last day we were level on match points with Dorset (6) but had won one fewer game point. Our match against Wiltshire was won in style winning 5-0, and then we waited on the result from the Dorset/Cornwall match, with Cornwall managing a 3-2 victory we were level on match points but had won one more game. This was an amazing result for the team, winning the Doris Abraham Trophy for the second year running.

The team which represented Somerset was Jade Cope, Jess Haines, Frankie Dezis, Ellen Reakes, Abby Gray, Aimee Sawyer, Sarah Burnell and Helen Hayward. The same seven players played in all the matches and have since been named the magnificent seven.

County 1st Team colours were awarded to Jess, Frankie, Abby and Ellen.

Somerset then qualified for the National Finals held at Stoneham Golf Club, the team which represented Somerset at Clevedon were joined by Harriet Lockley and Hannah Woodley. Stoneham Golf course was in excellent condition and the greens were very testing and fast.

All our matches where very closely contested, with many of the games going to the final holes. Somerset finished 5th this year, with a youthful Essex team the national champions. The standard of golf throughout the tournament was exceptional.

The support of Helen Hayward my vice-captain has been excellent throughout my time as captain and the preparation and support from our County Coach Terry Williams was as always great.

I've had an amazing 4 years being part of the county setup, leading the team to two national finals. I have been very lucky to have led a wonderful squad, who have matured into outstanding golfers. Many of them have supported National Events, travelling all over the UK.

The Captaincy now passes to Helen, the future is bright, an exciting time for Somerset golf with the wealth of talent coming through the junior ranks and I'm sure there will be more success over the coming years.

Vice Captain

Madam President, fellow Committee members and Delegates,

I've come a long way since my first ever 2nd team match in 2009 for Somerset. It's been a whirlwind of a first and only year as Vice Captain.

I would like to start by thanking the committee for all their support throughout the year.

2nd team matches

The first 2nd team match was against Wilshire hosted by Wells GC back in the end of May.

The team playing was Abby Gray, Ellen Reakes, Frankie Dezis, Libbie Dezis, Lili Marshall and Megan Wilde.

The team started with 3-0 win in the morning foursomes games, trying out a few new pairings. Then in the singles Somerset remained undefeated with 4 wins and 2 halves. Special well done to Lili winning her first ever second team matches 6&5 and 5&3.

The second regional match played in early June was held at Knowle GC versus Gloucestershire.

The team was Abby Gray, Ellen Reakes, Ffion Richardson, Frankie Dezis, Jess Haines and Lili Marshall.

After a 2-1 win in the morning we knew that the singles would be a close run game. After three of the six matches went down the last, Somerset finished with a 6-3 win and were into the 2nd team finals for the second year. Again another well done to Ffion playing in her first 2nd team match winning her foursomes 4&3 and halving her singles match.

2nd team finals

After the success at intercounties at Clevedon Abby, Frankie, Jess and Ellen all achieved their first team colours. This meant they were no longer eligible to play for the second team.

With the 'loss' of the four players, a new and very young team of Libbie Dezis, Lilianna Marshall, Ffion Richardson, Abi Moore and Megan Wilde all played in the second team final at Tiverton versus an experienced Cornwall, alongside our only over 18 player Amelia Matthews.

After a 2-1 defeat in the morning foursomes, the two losses going down the 18th hole, we had an uphill battle to try and retain the trophy.

Somerset made the turn up in all the singles matches, but Cornwall weren't going to give up that easily.

Amelia and Abi secured their points in the singles. Lili and Ffion both lost in closely contested matches (losing on 18 and 17 respectively).

This left the result on the last two matches. We needed 1.5 points to draw with Cornwall!

It was a nail biting finish with Libbie going down the last all square and Megan going down the last 1 up. Megan played the last hole beautifully to win her match and Libbie secured a half. This meant Cornwall and Somerset were both on 4.5 points.

After a quick debate on how we calculated the count back. It went back to holes won to decide the winner. Somerset coming out on top with a couple of big wins.

The stand out matches, which brought home the shield for Somerset were a 7&6 win for Amelia and Lili in the morning foursomes, and a 6&5 win for Abi in her very first 2nd team singles match.

The girls were a pleasure and did Somerset proud.

Inter counties and county finals

I learnt a lot attending the inter counties at Clevedon having only previously attended as a player and was so proud to be able to attend county finals. The first team is full of impressive strength and depth in golfing ability, we are fortunate to have such a lovely team who aren't playing for themselves but truly playing for Somerset.

Conclusion

The future is bright for the 2nd team and I look forward to seeing these new talents make their way into the first team and to future girls who are progressing from the impressive junior program.

To conclude my report, I would like to say a massive thank you to Gill, for her support, knowledge and friendship, I know she will be a tough act to follow. I am so proud to try and continue in her footsteps and take the team to county finals again.

I hope I can continue the success Gill and the team has grown.

This is a brilliant group to be a part of, the team is so supportive of each other and I look forward to inter counties at Cumberwell Park at the beginning of July.

Junior Reports

This year, since April and in the absence of a County Junior Organiser, I have had the pleasure of acting as a stand-in.

As always the junior programme has been very full this year. Somerset has so much to offer juniors; coaching, competitions and matches. In fact the most recent Autumn Meet at B&B, a Texas scramble, saw a very small 5 year old competing.

The Spring Meet at Tall Pines was won by Connie Cox from Mendip.

The following are some achievements from the girls this year.

The Girls' Championships over 36 holes, was held at Mendip in June. This was won by Frankie Dezis who plays off + 2.5 Her sister Libbie won the U15 36 hole gross, and the youngest in the family, Maisie won the 18 hole gross. A very impressive afternoon for the Dezis family! This year Frankie entered 16 national competitions, she came 1st in The West of England under 18s and tied 8th in the Helen Holme Scottish Ladies Open, amongst many other good results; too many to mention.

Libbie Dezis was chosen this year to join the SW training squad consisting of 8 girls, joining sister Frankie, Ellen Reakes from Mendip and Jess Haines from B&B. This half of the squad are from Somerset. Maisie Dezis, qualified to play at Quinta da Lago in the Justin Rose Daily Telegraph Junior final recently as one of the nett winners. This is a huge achievement, so many girls try to qualify for this.

You might be thinking that my report is all about the Dezis family! However, there are a lot more very talented juniors in Somerset.

Lilliana Marshall from Farrington, Abbi Moore from Wedmore and Ffion Richardson from Mendip all played in the County Championships at Clevedon in May.

Ffion has had a lot of success this year, winning the R&A Under 12 championships and she also won the Scotland Under12 championships. She came 2nd in the Welsh Under 14 championships, finally gaining 2nd in The Wee Wonders Championships narrowly missing 1st place by 1 shot.

Harriet Lockley from B&B plays off +4.5 and has played in 13 competitions abroad this year and came 25th in The World Girls Championships in Canada.

The SW Inter Counties this year was held at Carlyon Bay in August during the very hot weather. Thank goodness for a gentle sea breeze which kept us cooler than we might have been! Unfortunately, The Premier Inn, where we all stayed had no sea breeze!

We decided to take the younger girls this year to give them the opportunity and experience to play for Somerset, as the older juniors have played for the 1st, 2nd and junior teams many times.

Four of us took the team to Cornwall, Sandra Ford did all the starting and Dave Owen and his wife Jenny organised the safeguarding and welfare. We were all taxis and ferried the girls to and from the course each day. As always there was never enough time to fill in team sheets, work out shots, fill out cards, find somewhere to sit and have breakfast or lunch! and get the matches underway!

The team, apart from Megan Wilde had never represented Somerset before and they were brilliant. They received many compliments from other teams. Our young team was:-

Leah Bowden has been Junior Captain this year but alas tested positive for Covid the evening before we drove down to Cornwall, this was very disappointing for us and also, of course for her. Megan was thrilled to be the acting team captain for the 3 days. She will be the junior captain for 2023.

The girls experienced some tough matches as they were played off handicap and sometimes they were having to give lots of shots. The ground was very hard and difficult with lots of run as of course no rain had fallen for quite some time.

The foursomes pairing of Libbie Dezis and Millie Pearce was brilliant they played all the matches and lost none. Liliana Marshall had tough games and played very well, Abi Moore played 5 won 3 and halved one, a great achievement. All the girls played well and going into the last day we had defeated Glos and Wilts but lost to Cornwall and Devon. We played Dorset but narrowly lost 3/2 leaving us in 4th place, we were very happy with the result and Cornwall were the winners, (several of their girls were members of Carlyon Bay!) It was a terrific experience for all the girls and considering it was the first time they had played as a team they did exceptionally well.

As there was no food provided for the teams on Sunday and very little on Monday we ate out twice. The girls looked their best all dressed up and their behaviour was impeccable. Eating once at The Premier Inn (not to be recommended) and once in Charlestown, by the sea, which was excellent. Once we had all found our way there! We all had fish and chips or burgers of course! Leaving us Tuesday evening after the Gala Dinner for a paddle!

The team shows a lot of promise and all looks very exciting for the future of Somerset golf.

As Gill has mentioned, 4 of the county 1st team that won The SWIC championships were juniors and went on to the National Final at Stoneham in September.

As Helen's report stated the County 2nd team made it to the final against Cornwall. All of the team were juniors, except one, and the team were brilliant and as you know we won.

The girls have also played friendly matches against Ladies' Sections at Enmore, Long Sutton and Wedmore, and against the Devon Junior team. We are very grateful to these clubs and their ladies for these matches and for making their courses available. I know the girls thoroughly enjoy them and the sign up sheet is always full. Next year there will be a match against the U16 boys. We are also grateful to other clubs for the use of

their courses for competitions, Mendip, B&B, Tall Pines and 9 hole competitions at Tickenham, Wheathill and Weston Super Mare. Apologies if I have missed thanking other clubs.

A small bursary of £750 per year has been set up to help girls in the Somerset Coaching Squads, the fund is divided as follows. Junior Squads, up to Development £250, and the Performance Squad £500. This year 4 bursaries were awarded.

The Junior Committee has recently been strengthened by 2 parents, James Wilde and Sarah Whittock it is very helpful to have parent's views on many issues.

Eileen Binding has chaired the meetings and has worked consistently hard over many years, she is a fount of golfing knowledge.

Dave Owen has taken over the coaching and runs many "First for Golf" competitions for the younger ones. His work with the juniors is invaluable.

I would like to give a warm welcome to Lloyd Katz our new CJO. He is very well qualified for the role and comes from a background of teaching sport and organising events and is passionate about golf. We look forward to working together and I know he will be first class.

As you will have realised the Somerset Juniors are exceptionally talented. There are many girls, receiving coaching, waiting in the wings to join our teams. I know you agree that the future of Somerset Junior girls looks very bright.

COACHING

Dave Owen (read by Lesley Matthews) *

- 1. The last 21/22 coaching session took place on Sunday 8th May 2022. This year we provided coaching for 84 x girls across the county at 5 different venues:
 - a. Burnham & Berrow GC, Performance Squad coached by Katie Rule and Lee Corfield,
 - b. The Mendip GC, Development North Squad coached by Alex Todd,
 - c. Long Sutton GC, Development South Squad coached by Richard Anthrobus,
 - d. Wells GC, Futures North Squad coached by Terry Williams and Chris Coles,
 - e. Saltford GC, Academy Squad coached by Chris Coles.
- 2. Looking forward to the 22/23 coaching programme, we have maintained the same coaches and venues, but have introduced a Memorandum of Understanding for the Professionals, a new Code of Conduct for the girls and each girl has completed a Goal Setting Form with their Squad Professionals to give everyone a more focused and committed programme of supporting activities (h/c reduction; increased entry to competitions and individual practice regimes). The first coaching sessions took place on 9 October 2022.

EG SW Regional Committee Rep. Sandra Ford

At least this year the SW Region managed to hold some events. Unfortunately, once again the SW Championship at Upavon in August was cancelled. This is the third year in succession that this event has been cancelled and will be the subject of much debate in the coming months.

2022 has been a different year, we had hoped to return to normality after covid and lockdowns, but the County Competitions seem to have been affected in the same way that many Clubs competitions have been. Ladies' priorities have changed, with many now just wanting to play for fun.

Travel time and the cost of playing has also been a factor in some Ladies deciding not to play in County competitions, especially if they are being asked to pay £25 to play on their own course. Having said that, it must be remembered that for all the County run competitions £25 is a cheap way to play another course especially when green fees are now often over £50. Our entry fee also includes automatic entry for a 2's comp.

Despite the pressures, we will not be increasing our entry fees for 2023, but trying to find host clubs who will accommodate the County on a reduced green rate is becoming increasingly difficult.

Details of all the fixtures are on the website and the posters will be circulated in early January. We had to cancel the Fowler Lock for the second year running due to lack of entries, Greensomes and Foursomes are not popular formats, so next year the FL will be a 4BBB event.

Rule Changes, the main rule change effects the RC/CP .. if a lady has played for her club and then moves club in the same season, then she is ineligible to play for her new club until the following years competition.

IG, the move to signing up for competitions on IG has worked pretty well. Sign up for all 2023 competitions will open on 1st March. I am very strict in that there are no late entries allowed. When sign up has been open for 4 months and ladies haven't entered, then there will be no sympathy when they ask if they can be added after the sign up has closed (and yes this does happen)

IG does provide me with a source of amusement.... on the front page under the date, name and venue, in bold, are the details of the BACS payment (also on the website, general comp rules) I still get e mails saying "I have entered but I can't see how to pay".

Hopefully, now we have had bedding in process my amusement will be curtailed for next year!

Information - Angie and I have undertaken some research among the delegates, as many ladies golfers are not aware that the County Competitions are for them. There is an assumption that "County" means lower handicappers.

It appears the stopping block is Ladies Committees. Delegates feed information from our general meetings back to the committee, but how widely circulated are committee meeting minutes? If at all, or are then just put on a wall or in a file?

So, we are on a publicity drive! In February 2023 a newsletter will go to all the clubs with a request that every lady member is forwarded the newsletter via e mail and a copy is put somewhere prominent, whether that be a clubhouse noticeboard, a changing room board on on the back of a loo door. This will give general basic information to Ladies about who we are, what we offer and how to access competitions.

Please do plug our competitions, the FL, FB and Bowmaker are all events where ladies can play alongside their friends and their handicap is not affected. Ladies who enter the combined Handicap Championships can even choose playing partners even if they are in different competitions.....what's not to like!

Handicap Adviser

We are now two years into WHS, Ladies with plenty of scores in their handicap record should now have a Handicap Index that reflects their playing ability.

There have been a few little tweaks with the administration of the WHS system, for example the PCC calculation has been adjusted we are told. But no major changes.

Some Clubs I hear from quite a bit, some I never hear from, I would love to think those clubs know what they are doing but I get some worrying feedback now and again.

Most commonly I hear of General Play Scores being done in team competitions, including in Ladies Open Bowmakers.

The incorrect Handicap Allowances being used, again in Ladies Open Bowmakers. The Handicap Allowances are Mandatory. 100% is not FUN it is wrong.

Competitions being made into a Non-Qualifier because a hole or two are out of play. WHY? We have the ability to take holes out of the competition and make it a 17, 16 or less holes qualifier. For handicap as long as there are 10 holes, the correct length, completed it can count. (9 holes must be completed in a 9 hole competition)

Winning scores in team competitions in some clubs have been getting higher, 50 points in a 4BBB is not unheard of. It will be interesting to see if this settles down.

However, by using minimum scores in a Handicap Record, maximum Handicaps and/or divisions this can be accommodated.

The Club Handicap reviews are now due, must be done by a committee with a minimum of 3 members. Any problems do get in touch with me.

I have just been to a national WHS presentation, no major changes, but information about player and club responsibilities and changes to the Platform reports, and some facts and figures. We (SLCGA & SGU together) will be delivering this to clubs early in the new year after your AGMs, so we get to see your new Handicap & Competition secretaries.

Also watch out for an update to the Rules of Golf coming out in January. Again, nothing major but a few little tweaks.

Look forward to seeing all the clubs at the Handicap and Competition meeting in the new year.

Although saying I am pleased people contact me sounds a bit odd. I am pleased people, parents, coaches County Officials do contact to discuss a concern or a query. Volunteers and other helpers worry that they are not registered or they are not suitable and I can talk them through that. The lead person working with Juniors and regular helpers need a Safeguarding CBR check but occasional helpers, supervised by a lead person do not.

I work closely with our Junior Committee and feel l offer simple but sound advice. Concerns as not just about Juniors, club sections can exclude players for various reason and we need to encourage inclusivity at all levels, especially, disability and health needs.
